My year as Mayor of Sedgefield has been extremely rewarding and enjoyable. During the last 12 months, I have had the opportunity to spend time with some of the very many groups and individuals in Sedgefield who help to sustain our wonderful community.

I have also enjoyed meeting other civic dignitaries, either welcoming them to Sedgefield, or at events around the North East. It was always a huge pleasure to show off our town to visitors and a great honour to represent the community on occasions such as Remembrance Sunday, and other moments in the year that are very important to the people of Sedgefield, including me.

From the very start of the year, I set out to try and reach out to a new audience as mayor. Building on the excellent work of my predecessors, I wanted to do things a little less formally at times, and that informed much of my approach to the role. I also did my bit to invest a sense of fun into some events involving the mayor. I hope that the community will forgive me for my personalised Santa hat at the Snow Party and the printed chains of office on my Mayoral Marathon running vest!

One of the privileges of being mayor was that I was able to raise money for good causes during the year. I chose three charities that are close to my heart for different reasons - The Lullaby Trust, Sir Bobby Robson Foundation and Friends of Sedgefield Harriers - and also promised to support other local good causes. I managed to raise over £7,200, which will be shared among the three charities and community groups. This was only possible thanks to the many people who supported my events and I am extremely grateful to everyone who contributed.

The team at Sedgefield Town Council has been incredibly supportive at every stage. I owe them a huge debt of thanks. Likewise, many of my fellow town councillors have attended or supported my events, as have county councillors

Fletcher Room Refurbishment - WORK HAS BEGUN!

That's right, the Fletcher Room refurbishment is underway! The chosen contractors began work in the Fletcher Room and elsewhere in the Parish Hall on Monday 8th May 2017.

The work is set to be completed by Friday 9th June 2017 and will see all new décor, windows, insulation, flooring and soundproofing properties in the Fletcher Room, while the adjoining office will be transformed into a fully-equipped kitchen with a serving hatch leading into the Fletcher Room. A number of other major works are also currently being carried out alongside the Fletcher Room refurbishment to minimise disruption to Parish Hall use, including: new flooring in the foyer, ladies WC and men's WC; installation of Wi-Fi; drainage work and sanding and treatment of the main hall's dancefloor. Sedgefield Town Council would like to take this opportunity to say a sincere thank you to all Parish Hall users for your cooperation during this period and we can't wait for you to see the results!

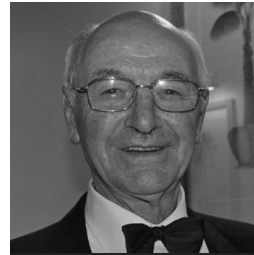
Councillor Carr says that he is looking forward once again to chairing the council and continuing work on behalf of the town, working alongside those returning and new councillors.

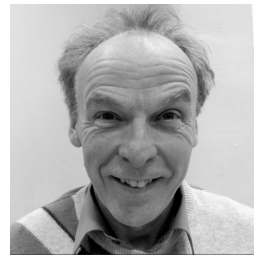
Allan Blakemore

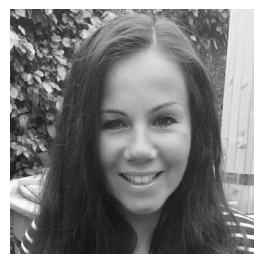
Vanessa Carmichael

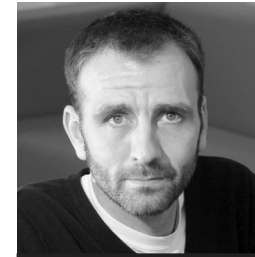
Jo Elliott

Youth Provision IN SEDGEFIELD

In recent editions of the Extra, we have reported on the work that is being done to improve facilities and activities for young people in Sedgefield.

This is being led by the town council's Youth Working Group, but crucially, has involved wide ranging engagement with and input from young people, who are helping to shape the future of youth provision in the town. The town council has allocated resources to sustain this project and among other initiatives, we are delighted to confirm that a regular youth club will be starting up in the near future.

The plan is to base the club in the Fletcher Room once that has been refurbished, with dedicated regular sessions for young people aged under and over 11. These will be managed by fully qualified youth workers. As soon as

the full details of the youth club have been finalised, we will use a wide range of channels to publicise the sessions to young people. Once the club is up and running, we will review it on a regular basis, to ensure that it is delivering what young people need and is an effective use of public money.

There are other youth provision ideas in the pipeline and we will continue to make sure that young people play a key role in developing (and in time delivering) those.
