COUNCIL TAX PRECEPT 2024/25

Over recent years there have been significant changes in local government funding which has culminated in the removal of grant funding for this council, however this is offset to some extent by new housing. It is anticipated that further change will also be seen in the coming years. Every year, each Town and Parish Council sets a precept which is a charge that is determined locally and is added to, and collected along with, Council Tax. This precept money is then used to provide services and amenities within the parish.

Sedgefield Town Council is all too aware of the pressures of the current economic climate and the cost of living. We have made a commitment for 2024/25 to continue to deliver our existing services and programme of community events while also progressing the expansion of Butterwick Road Cemetery, undertaking a significant programme of tree works around the town and protecting areas of village green. There will be increases to Parish Hall hire, cemetery fees and allotment fees but these will be in-line with the current rate of inflation. The pricing structure for hiring the Parish Hall continues to support usage by local groups.

The rise in Sedgefield Town Council's precept equates to an increase of 6.8% or £13.22 per Band D household per annum.

THE QUEEN'S TREE: COMMEMORATIVE TREE UPDATE

Towards the end of 2023, the Town Council planted a commemorative tree in the grounds of Old Beacon Lane Cemetery. This black walnut tree is to be known as The Queen's Tree.

A commemorative plaque has also been installed in front of the tree, reflecting that this tree is planted on behalf of all residents in Sedgefield Parish in commemoration of the late HM Queen Elizabeth II. The species of tree and its location were chosen with the hope that it can grow into a veteran tree and be enjoyed by many future generations.



HEADSTONE SAFETY TESTING 2023: COMPLETE

Our annual headstone safety testing for 2023/24 has been completed. Unfortunately, we have identified a small number of headstones that require urgent attention. These headstones have been marked with red/white warning tape and an advisory notice placed in the cemetery noticeboard. The council has contacted next of kin, where details are known, detailing the next steps. If you are visiting the cemetery and find a headstone marked with warning tape, please contact us so that we can provide you with the necessary advice on what to do next. If repair work is not undertaken by 28th March 2024, the council will oversee a programme of work to lay down these headstones.
