BUTTERWICK ROAD CEMETERY EXPANSION:

LATSEST UPDATE



Several years ago, the town council made a commitment to expand Butterwick Road Cemetery to ensure Sedgefield continued to have a burial facility. Since that commitment was made, a huge amount of work has taken place in terms of land purchase; project design and costings; submission of planning application; undertaking commencement conditions included groundwater which testing and archaeological digs; preparing detailed specifications; and performing a robust tendering exercise. A specialist contractor commissioned to work with the town council throughout this project.

All planning matters have now been approved and a contractor appointed. Work on-site will commence in early Spring 2025 and should take around 4 months to complete. A new access road is being created with turning circle for funeral vehicles, new paths will be made and the shelter in the existing area of the cemetery will be redesigned to create a walk-way feature linking the existing and new areas. This project will ensure the town has a burial facility several generations to come.

We will continue to keep you updated on this project.

COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION

Notice is hereby given that by reason of councillor resignation one vacancy has occurred among the members of the Town Council. Any persons willing to fill this vacancy should request from the Clerk an application form and return this on or before noon on Friday 22nd November 2024. The applicant's name must appear on the current register of the Voters List or the applicant should during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date resided in or within three miles of the parish or the applicant's only place of work during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date is in the parish. The applicant must not be debarred from standing as a councillor.

PUBLIC elections cannot be held until the year 2025 but for the interim period election to the aforesaid council will be voted for by the present sitting number of councillors.

HEADSTONE SAFETY TESTING 2024

Sedgefield Town Council is legally required to undertake headstone safety testing annually to ensure that headstones are stable and safe. Testing in Butterwick Road Cemetery, Beacon Lane Cemetery and Winterton Cemetery will take place soon. Any headstones found to be unstable will be marked with warning tape and we will, where such details are known, contact the next of kin as well as place advisory notices on the cemetery noticeboard.
